Available services include intake-triage; crisis intervention; individual psychotherapy; group therapy; parent intervention, psychological assessment; pharmacotherapy and medication management; and clinical consultation with other professionals and community collaborators in other service delivery systems, including early childhood programs. All children admitted to the service receive a comprehensive initial assessment and some form of individual psychotherapy with corresponding parent or family intervention. The setting emphasizes the integration of a developmental perspective on youth psychotherapy with a community perspective on service delivery. Regular clinical consultation with the school and child protection system (as well as community providers) is commonplace to support optimizing treatment course and outcomes.

For adult services, individuals must have a documented disability that impacts the individual's ability to prepare for, obtain or maintain employment.

Level Up Services: provides students with disabilities ages 16-22 with pre-employment services. Those services are the following: job exploration, counseling for post-secondary education, work-based learning experiences, work readiness training, and self-advocacy. The best time for students to connect with Level Up Services is when they are two years away from graduation.

Vocational Rehabilitation Services: BRS provides eligible youth and adults with disabilities assistance with preparing for employment, finding employment, and keeping employment. Our services are individualized and may include (but are not limited to) technology services, assess to tools and equipment needed and supported employment.

Services: CT InCK is a child & adolescent centered local service delivery state payment model that aims to improve the quality of care for children through preventive care, early identification, behavioral health, social determinants of health and physical health needs. Eligible families include children covered under HUSKY Health CT and pregnant and postpartum women covered by HUSKY Health CT. The CT InCK model will allow states and local providers to better address these needs by providing resources using the wraparound model to reach these goals. The Intensive Care Coordinator creates a care plan based on the healthy Journey Questionnaire results. The ICC works to prevent medical gaps in care, community resources needed, coordinating educational supports and liaison services with medical providers.

Care Coordinators work with any child or adolescent with a medical, physical, mental health or behavioral health condition. This includes children and young adults with multiple providers where parents and caregivers need help coordinating their child's care, newly diagnosed patients who may need support and/or education surrounding their new diagnosis and families who need help connecting to resources, services, and care related to their child's special healthcare needs. Care Coordinators help families by developing and implementing a custom care plan that addresses child-specific needs. Care coordinator works as a liaison between the primary care doctor, specialists, school and any other organization involved in the child or youth's care. Providing advocacy on behalf of the child to maximize their potential and provide them with optimal healthcare regardless of economic and social/cultural barriers.
